NEWS FROM THE CAMPAIGN

While you all are helping us mainly on the field side of the campaign, I wanted to share with you an important and exciting fundraising update. The results are in—and they underscore the powerful energy, momentum, and deep support we are building for our team. In short, no matter how you look at the fundraising numbers, Team Phil is on top.

Thanks to the support of each of you and thousands of other supporters, our campaign's momentum continues to grow. Here are a few key numbers:

- We raised over \$1,000,000 in the second quarter;
- We have raised more than \$3 million this cycle from 7,600 individual supporters;
- We have nearly \$2.5 million cash on hand (almost double that of our opponent); and
- More than 85% of our donors this quarter are from Colorado.

The fundraising numbers parallel what we are feeling out in the field. Consider that, despite Senator Bennet's longer run in elected office, more current and former elected officials have endorsed Phil's campaign. In short, they know what it takes to govern our state and recognize, as Phil recently put it, that he "know[s] our state government inside and out, from every agency to every issue; [he] can hit the ground running. Michael Bennet will have a huge learning curve if he's to do this job." And they also recognize, as we are hearing again and again, that Colorado needs a fighter as our next Governor. This article on Phil's recent trip to the San Luis Valley developed that point very effectively.

Phil recently joined <u>Simon Rosenberg's Hopium Chronicles</u>, talking about his litigation against the federal government. Their conversation centers around the key role democratic AGs have been playing as bulwarks against the Trump administration's lawless and harmful actions. Phil also joined Chris Lopez's <u>Alamosa Citizen Valley Pod</u> to talk about his work in the San Luis Valley, and he joined Brody Wilson in Montrose for a <u>Local Motion</u> interview, to discuss his work on the Western Slope.

Bennet in the Senate, Weiser for governor: The perfect pair

Colorado is fortunate to have two experienced Democratic leaders vying for governor. Your July 17 article highlights how Attorney General Phil Weiser's early entry has energized grass-roots support, making him the candidate most in tune with Colorado's everyday concerns. He has built a broad coalition of union members (backed by the AFL-CIO), Latino voters (endorsed by the Latino Democratic Caucus), rural communities, and suburban progressives.
This contest isn't about who

is most qualified but about where each can best serve Col-

oradans. Sen. Michael Bennet's 16

vears in the Senate have earned him seats on four high-impact committees: Agriculture, Finance, Rules and Administration, and the Select Commit-tee on Intelligence. His seniority grants him ranking-member roles on subcommittees that deliver infrastructure dollars, broadband expansion, drought relief and agricultural support directly to our communities. We cannot afford to lose his influence in those forums.

Meanwhile, Phil Weiser's six years as attorney general have produced real, statewide impact from the Eastern Plains to the Western Slope. He convened wildfire-mitigation task forces that unite local fire districts and firsthand how federal funding state agencies, expanded nal-oxone distribution in both rural counties and urban centers.

Addressing the Bennet Poll (from the Campaign team)

We always expected and knew that Senator Bennet would start this campaign with high name identification given his nearly two decades as an elected official in Washington. What surprised us and others is that despite him being well known (nearly 90% of primary voters have an opinion of him) and his longevity in public office, he starts at 53%. And, as the article pointed out, Phil's name identification and familiarity with voters has jumped substantially over the last several months—no doubt due to our hustle on the campaign trail and the work Phil is doing as Colorado's AG standing up to the Trump Administration.

The question not addressed in the poll's public report is the one flagged by the Denver Post editorial when Senator Bennet announced his candidacy— "is it best for Colorado to have Michael Bennet and his seniority in the Senate serving us there or as Governor?" We know the answer to that question—Colorado is best served with both Phil and Senator Bennet staying in public service, with Bennet in the Senate and Phil as our next Governor. These two letters to the editor, with one by a veteran Democratic Party leader, say it well.

Our path to victory in this race is becoming more and more clear–we will work harder, smarter, and have a more compelling vision and message for all Coloradans. As Phil said last week: "We have the fundraising and grassroots support we need to contest this race

all the way to election day. Coloradans deserve a competitive primary among candidates who show up across our state to ask for their vote and have a rigorous debate. We're going to give them one."
